- 1. Annual Report and Trails report was circulated. These have been submitted to Societies Act Registrar and Ministry of Lands, Forests and Environment.
- 2. **Parking and traffic in front of machine shop.** Concerns were raised with respect to the Kamloops Astronomical Society's special stargazing event. There were about 60 cars parked. It is supposed to be closed to vehicles according to Section 25. Users perceive a wrong message. Permission had been given from Recreation Sites officer and OSC was not informed.
- 3. Club website Jane gave the Board a walkthrough demonstration of the new website.
 - There are hotlinks to businesses when mentioned.
 - It was suggested that a geo reference be activated to link where a person is on the map. Please send Jane photos of people in action with their names, groomers and executive.
 - It was suggested that a recognition page be set up for groups of volunteers. Any more links please give to Jane.
 - It was suggested to make the moving pictures still.
 - Microsoft no longer supports window Explorer 8. It would cost \$1000 plus to upgrade. It was suggested that a popup be created to let people know using this browser.
 - New website feedback. A simple survey to the membership asking for their feedback on the new website should be sent out. Jane to follow up.
- 4. **Progress on trail improvements** It was reported that falling has been completed on the new Rustler Trail. Logs need to be hauled out. It should be a nice skiable trial similar to the Lookout. Clean up will continue before the snow falls.
 - Financial cost is not known at this time. Funds on the sale of the logs to be used on the site.
 - Compensation for the logging company for their time and machine? Project should be revenue neutral for the club.
- 5. **Washroom Update** Luc gave his update with the washrooms. The project is moving forward. The building has been painted inside. Cabinets need to go in and then the plumber can go in. The door is in.
 - Grading needs to be done with gravel to get rid of the mud.
 - Water and power to pump. It is a 2-week process to purge the well. Water samples need to be taken to determine the type of filtration system to be installed.
 - Financial situation is not known at this time, as bills have not been submitted yet.
 - Partitions need to go up. Luc to send an email looking for help as it is handyman work.
 - Floor needs to be cleaned and painted.
