Meeting called to order at 7:02 pm.

Opening remarks

At CCBC AGM Vesta learned that clubs can only use the last three years' contributions to restricted funds when applying for grants. Maureen will look into it.

Membership

Online registration can be set up anytime once we decide on fees. There will be a recommendation from the Trails committee once they have their next meeting; we can vote by email. September 1 registration opening would allow for kids in the training program to sign up at the same time. Discussion of raising fees or not. We have been the same for three years and we are at the low end compared to other areas. We need to decide before September as Joan will not be available.

Strategy

Maureen attended a grant writing seminar for capital projects. We've addressed the issues why we didn't receive the grant last year. The application deadline is July 31. Need to include three quotes for a snow cat and a letter saying we would qualify for financing.

Operations

Financial – code 5740 on the previous financial statement is Zone 4 credit card fees. This should be separated from CCBC amounts as it does not go to CCBC.

Trails - meeting again before July.

No KBRA Stomp this year.

West Fraser will have equipment in the area this summer.

Saw course - could be upcoming.

Board Business

Motion from Alan to accept May meeting minutes. Seconded by Maureen. Carried.

New business - KBRA is very interested in collaborating. They have applied to Rec Sites and Trails to convert snowshoe trails to bike trails in the summer.

Snowshoers need help wayfinding. Tim is willing to be snowshoe coordinator. Having more non-motorized users will help prevent damage and vandalism. More signs are needed, we could also create a trail safety video.

Trail maintenance - promote earlier on. Ski trails are mostly adopted. Snowshoe trails need maintenance with power saws.

Volunteer hours will be added up again in September.

CCBC AGM - most clubs pay student coaches but not as staff - honourariums based on hours (gas money), which is what we are currently doing.

Discussion of seasonal workers - is their contract clear that we can terminate, how much notice do we need to give.

Discussion of coaching certification (CCBC), we should hold a training day here.

Dog trails setup - discuss in the fall. Could put papers under windshield wipers indicating how to pay.
